



NYCDPR Dyckman Farmhouse Museum

Built by William Dyckman in approximately 1784, this farmhouse was once the center of a thriving farm more than 250 acres in size. The last surviving Dutch Colonial farmhouse in the area, Dyckman Farmhouse, along with the smoke-house and reconstructed "Hessian Hut," has been a public museum since 1916.

A member of the Historic House Trust, the work of the Dyckman Farmhouse, located at 204th Street and Broadway in Manhattan involved interior and exterior included reconstruction and restoration. AG provided complete MEP design that incorporates a state of the art fiber optic lighting system, new mechanical and electrical systems and interior and exterior fire prevention systems for the rehabilitation of this historic building.
